# **The Context (2:1–11)**



Unselfish service for others patterned after the example of Christ's humility and obedience.

  - -"Work out" what is already implanted within.
    - Illustration of a mine.
    - Illustration of a seed that has germinated.

Romans 7:17

So now, no longer am I the one doing it, but sin which dwells in me.



## "work out your salvation"

Romans 7:8

But sin, taking opportunity through the commandment, produced in me coveting of every kind; for apart from the Law sin is dead.

Romans 5:3

And not only this, but we also exult in our tribulations, knowing that tribulation brings about perseverance;

Philippians 4:1

Therefore, my beloved brethren whom I long to see, my joy and crown, in this way stand firm in the Lord, my beloved.

  - -"just as you have always obeyed"



- 2 Corinthians 10:2–6
  - <sup>3</sup> For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, <sup>4</sup> for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses.



- 2 Corinthians 10:2–6
  - <sup>5</sup> We are destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ, <sup>6</sup> and we are ready to punish all disobedience, whenever your obedience is complete.



- Who?— "beloved"
- How?—
  - -"just as you have always obeyed"
  - -"but now much more in my absence"
  - -"with fear and trembling"



Ephesians 6:5

<sup>5</sup> Slaves, be obedient to those who are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in the sincerity of your heart, as to Christ; <sup>6</sup> not by way of eyeservice, as men-pleasers, but as slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart.



- 1 Corinthians 2:2–5
  - <sup>2</sup> For I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and Him crucified. <sup>3</sup> I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling,



## "work out your salvation"

1 Corinthians 2:2–5

<sup>4</sup> and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, <sup>5</sup> so that your faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God.



- Why?
  - -"for it is God who is at work in you"



1 Thessalonians 2:13

For this reason we also constantly thank God that when you received the word of God which you heard from us, you accepted *it* not as the word of men, but *for* what it really is, the word of God, which also performs its work in you who believe.



1 Corinthians 12:6
 There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons.



Ephesians 3:20

Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us,



Colossians 1:29

For this purpose also I labor, striving according to His power, which mightily works within me.



- Why?
  - -"for it is God who is at work in you"
    - "both to will and to work"
      - "for His good pleasure"
