

Who is the king of Psalm 2?

- Is He David?
 - 2 Samuel 7:14 "I will be a father to him and he will be a son to Me; when he commits iniquity, I will correct him with the rod of men and the strokes of the sons of men."
 - 2 Samuel 10 The Ammonites and Arameans attacked Israel during David's reign.

- Who is the king of Psalm 2?
 - **Is He Solomon?**
 - 1 Chronicles 17:13—14 "I will be his father and he shall be My son . . ."
 - 1 Chronicles 22:9—10 ". . . He shall be My son and I will be his father . . ."

- Who is the king of Psalm 2?
 - Is He Ahaz?
 - **Isaiah 7 -** Syrians & Israelites attack Judah at the time the Assyrians were also a threat.
 - 2 Chronicles 28 Ahaz's idolatry and unfaithfulness to the Lord.

Who is the king of Psalm 2?

- Is He Messiah?
 - 2:1-3 Universal Insubordination
 - **2:4–6** God's Wrath
 - 2:7–9 Universal Dominion & Judgment
 - 2:10—12 Spiritual Service, Fear, & Submission
 - 2:12 Spiritual Blessing



12 So He said, "A nobleman went to a distant country to receive a kingdom for himself, and then return. 13 And he called ten of his slaves, and gave them ten minas and said to them, 'Do business with this until I come back.' 14 But his citizens hated him and sent a delegation after him, saying, 'We do not want this man to reign over us.' 15 When he returned, after receiving the kingdom, he ordered that these slaves, . . . "
