Zechariah 12:10–14

on the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the Spirit of grace and of supplication, so that they will look on Me whom they have pierced; and they will mourn for Him, as one mourns for an only son, and they will weep bitterly over Him like the bitter weeping over a firstborn.

Zechariah 12:10–14

- 11 "In that day there will be great mourning in Jerusalem, like the mourning of Hadadrimmon in the plain of Megiddo.
- 12 "The land will mourn, every family by itself; the family of the house of David by itself and their wives by themselves; the family of the house of Nathan by itself and their wives by themselves;

Zechariah 12:10–14

- 13 the family of the house of Levi by itself and their wives by themselves; the family of the Shimeites by itself and their wives by themselves;
- 14 all the families that remain, every family by itself and their wives by themselves.

- One like a son of man in the middle (13–16)
 - ✓ Robe
 - ✓ Sash
 - ✓ Head and hair
 - ✓ Eyes
 - √ Feet
 - ✓ Voice
 - √ 7 stars in His right hand
 - ✓ Sharp two-edged sword out of His mouth
 - √ Face

John's Vision

- 7 golden lampstands (12)
- One like a son of man in the middle (13–16)
- Jesus touches John and speaks (17–18)
 - √ "Do not be afraid"
 - √ The "I am"
 - o "the first and the last"
 - o "the living One"
 - o"I was dead"
 - o "I am alive forevermore"
 - o "I have the keys of death and Hades"

The Revelation of the Mystery of the Stars and Lampstands

- a. 7 stars = "the angels of the seven churches"
 - Spirit beings
 - ✓ Angels mentioned 71x in Revelation
 - ✓ Church at Ephesus had plurality of elders
 - Human messengers
 - ✓ Addressed in the 7 letters
 - ✓ Use of angelos for human messengers
 - ✓ Early church leadership—plurality
 - ✓ Representatives of the churches
- b. 7 lampstands = "the seven churches"

Implications Regarding Jesus Christ

- He is the eternal God.
- He communicates with His people through His Word.
- He loves us.
- He released us from our sins.
- He possesses all authority over the churches.
