5	Ptolemy I (Soter) 323-285 B.C.	Seleucus I (Nicator) 312-281 B.C.
—		Antiochus I (Soter) 281-261 B.C.
6	Ptolemy II (Philadelphus) 285-246 B.C.	Antiochus II (Theos) 261-246 B.C. [alliance with Ptolemy II by marriage to Berenice; Antiochus II's former wife Laodice poisoned him and killed Berenice]
7-9	Ptolemy III (Euergetes) 246-222 B.C. [brother of Berenice; put Laodice to death]	Seleucus II (Callinicus) 246-225 B.C. [son of Laodice whom she set up as king]
10		Seleucus III (Soter or Ceraunus) 225-223 B.C.
10-19	Ptolemy IV (Philopator) 222-203 B.C. [vv. 11-12] Ptolemy V (Epiphanes) 203-181 B.C. [vv. 14-17] [v. 17: marriage to Cleopatra, daughter of Antiochus the Great]	Antiochus III (the Great) 223-187 B.C. [at Sidon in 198 B.C. he defeated the Egyptian general Scopas and ended the Ptolemaic control over Palestine]
20		Seleucus IV (Philopator) 187-175 B.C. [son of Antiochus the Great]
21-35	Ptolemy VI (Philometor) 181-146 B.C. [son of Ptolemy V; “prince of the covenant” because of alliance with Antiochus III by the marriage of Ptolemy V to Cleopatra; one of 2 sons of Cleopatra; nephew of Antiochus IV (brother of Cleopatra)]	Antiochus IV (Epiphanes or Epimanes) 175-164 B.C. [defeated Ptolemy VI at Pelusium in 170 B.C.]
